

**Summary of Substantive Revisions to the
Local Rules of the U.S. Bankruptcy Court for the District of Kansas**

LBR 1007.1, which governs the order in which to file the petition and other documents, was reformatted from outline format to table format.

LBR 2002.2 updated noticing addresses for the Veterans Administration and the Kansas Department for Aging and Disability Services.

LBR 2014.1 governing employment of professionals was revised.

LBR 3002.1.1 is a new rule governing statements for secured debts secured by a residence. It is a revised version of former Standing Order 08-4.

LBR 3015(b).2 is a new rule governing conduit mortgage payments. It is a revised version of former Standing Order 11-3.

LBR 4002.3(a)(1) removed the requirement to send the U.S. Attorney's Office a copy of pre-petition tax returns that are filed after the petition.

LBR 5005.1, Appendix Section VI amended the procedures for filing sealed documents and motions to file documents under seal. Now those documents must generally be filed electronically rather than in hard copy format.

LBR 9006.1 is a new rule making bridge orders unnecessary.

Standing Order 08-4 (governing statements for secured debts secured by a residence) was abrogated but revised and adopted as LBR 3002.1.1.

Standing Order 11-3 (governing conduit mortgage payments) was abrogated but revised and adopted as LBR 3015(b).2.

Standing Order 12-1 (former local Chapter 13 Plan form) was abrogated by Standing Order 17-1.

Standing Order 14-4 (modifying former local Chapter 13 Plan form and conduit mortgage rule) was abrogated by Standing Order 17-1.

Second Amended Standing Order 17-1 is new and adopts the new Chapter 13 Plan form and abrogates Standing Orders 11-3, 12-1, and 14-4.

Standing Order 17-2 is new; it deals with a one-year pilot project and temporarily amends LBR 9019.2 to adopt new mediation provisions.

Standing Order 18-1 is new and amends LBR 9029.3 to add the Chapter 12 Trustee to the Bankruptcy Bench Bar Committee as an ad hoc member.
